Remembrance: From a Port Aransas beach to a beach in Normandy

Austin, May 30th. Memorial Day. There were about a billion people on the beach at Port A ...including a sandy bunch who paraded by with a flag and a sign "Take the ME out of Memorial Day." The run down to the coast this weekend was a last ditch effort to improve a very soggy May attitude with a little tanning session and the sound of the surf. All month we wondered what to do about the blank newsletter that just sat there not writing itself. *Hmmm. Take the Me out of Memorial Day... the miraculous muse... "we" needn't write a thing—better stuff by a better hand had already been written a few years back* Below are two pages from



6.7 The larger part of the battalion the loaded on a LST (Landing Ship Tanks) On the afternoon of June 5th. We know the schedule of the invasion, and know the major partion of our unit would be in reserve, with a later landing scheduled. Vehicles and men were loadel in reverse order of their departure. dowing the tomospert about a spent much of the time reading the thick manual on " operation Warlord" the detailed plants of the entire invasion, she food was far better than we were accustomed to esting. The fresh based bread tasted almost as good as angel food cane. We would be unloading inding from the LST onto LCVP's. (Landing Graft Version & Each LCVP) held 30 men. The early morning before clambering onto the LCPS, it was asked to lead a prayer service for our small group. Several of the men gave prayers If then asked the men to bow their heads and lift their hands if they had publicly & confessed Christ as their Saviar. With their hands still raised of asked other mento raise their hands if they placed their trust in God. We heard General Eisenhower address as we approached harmandy. about 2 miles from share, we began loading into the small boots You went over the side of the h ST and climbed down a he ary rope netting. With the high waves, the boat would be within 5 feet of you and the next second it would be 20 feet below. Good tening was required to make the jump. As we reared the beach, the boat on our right hit a mine and was literally blown to pieces. The gas masks was fastened high on our chests and had enough captured air to help keep the soldiers aflost. We didn't land on the beach. The ramp on the boat (the frontena) dropped and we jumped off in water up to our belt line and about 100 feet from where

The no word came by radio Col, Whiteford said " Dobbe take a couple of men and radio man, and try to find out what the hell is going on around game the troops were strafed by planes with alled markings. I was lying in a ditch when I heard a "whack" in my back, I head on I heavy j'achet. Then it tasted blood, On one of the men tare of my clothing, sprinkled Sulfa powders on the made twood wound, of redressed, a bullet in my back. and testing blood, I thought to myself "This is it. this is it! The truth . . the fragment in my back was probably from a 50 caliber bullet which Expladed on titting a tree limb. The blood on my face was coming from a small metal fragment stuck into my left ear love. I walked been to reported been to (There went 20 casualties)

...and that was only D-Day and a few days on the other side. There were many more wounds, more returns to the front, more stories that he lived to write down many years later...details burned in his memory like it was yesterday, but which he never talked about. This is for remembrance of all who served—from the Civil War to today in Iraq and Afghanistan—but especially of those who served and didn't come home. —TLHH.
